Herb - Last week after a good interview for our healthcare coordinator, I wanted to call you but couldn't find a number for you in all my various contact lists. So, this issue we have with a bill from the Hawaii State Legislature reminded me that I actually have a couple things to contact you about.

(1) The Governor asked if I could contact CMS on how they might view HB1134 (see link below). I understand that you and others may have spoken to HMSA during the recent legislative session about this bill. The Governor wants to know if you could suggest who I should reach out to for an opinion (formal or informal) on the bill. The questions surround the concern that even slightly amending Hawaii's Prepaid Health Care Act to remove the "sunset clause" could spur a legal challenge that could bring down our whole employer mandate/pre-emption to ERISA.
