For the past 9 years, Susan French has been a trial attorney with the Criminal Section of the Civil Rights Division, USDOJ. Presently assigned to the Human Trafficking Unit, Susan has prosecuted single and multiple victim human trafficking cases including: [U.S. v. Cuello](#) (migrant worker threats case-Ft Myers, FL); [U.S. v Tecum](#) (single Guatemalan victim domestic servitude case-Ft. Myers, FL); [U.S. Kil Soo Lee](#) (sweat shop slavery case - largest victim class human trafficking case prosecuted by US (mostly Vietnamese and some Chinese workers)-Honolulu); [U.S. v. Calimlim](#) (single Fillipina victim domestic servitude case (victim in household 19 years) Milwaukee, WI); and [U.S. v. Evans](#) (migrant worker case-multiple victims over 20 year period-all homeless American citizens - Jacksonville, FL.).

Susan was previously the State prosecutor in Virginia from 1989 to 1998. While there, she prosecuted child sexual assaults, domestic violence, drugs, and other violent crimes. She served as the Special prosecutor for Multi-jurisdictional grand jury targeting upper level drug dealers.

Susan served on the Task Force on Sex Discrimination, Civil Rights Division (1977-1980). She was also the Supervisory Attorney- Coordination and Review, Civil Rights Division (1980-1987).

Ms. French is a graduate of the Marshall Wythe School of Law, College of William and Mary.
